Advancing Rio Conventions through subnational action

4-phases

- 1. 1992 2000: Major groups and Local Agenda 21
- 2. 2000-2012 : partnerships
- 3. 2012 2016: converging agendas LA21+MDGs+Habitat= Agenda2030
- 4. 2016 2023: seeding multilevel collaboration

Lessons learned

- 1. Local and regional governments are key for ALL national commitments and global goals.
- 2. Sustainable urbanization is instrumental to respect planetary boundaries.
- 3. Multilevel partnerships of the Urban World offer beacon of hope for just transformation in the age of emergencies.








Highlights of LGMA COP29 Roadmap — as of February 2024
